PARTY PAYMENTS AS APPROVED BY SENATE ARE PASSED BY HOUSE

Funds to Aid Disposal of Surplus Crops Included. DISTRIBUTION IS ALTERED. House Action Boosts Farm Bill to Nearly One Billion Dollars.

WASHINGTON, May 9.

(AP)—The agriculture department appropriation bill for the next fiscal year was boosted to approximately \$1,000,000 today when the house voted to go along with the senate in adding \$121,000,000 "parity" payments to farmers and \$85,000,000 to dispose of surplus crops.

3-D BLITZKRIEG BEGUN; NATIONS PLEAD FOR AID

Allies Promise All Assistance In Power. Waves of Bombers Launch War Over Belgium, Bombing Brussels and Antwerp Airports—Britain Occupies Iceland As Protective Measure—Low Countries Mobilize All Troops.

Germany swept in her third blitzkrieg war over the Netherlands, Belgium and Luxembourg—just before dawn today.

The three invaded countries promptly appealed for aid to France and Britain, and the Netherlands legation in London announced assistance was coming. England, almost at the same time, descended on Iceland and took that island into "protective" custody, the term Adolf Hitler has used for his conquests of Denmark, Norway and now for the three little countries whose occupation would give him nearby air bases to bomb England and make a path for his armies to attack directly British troops based behind the little Maginot line south of Belgium guarding the north end of France.
