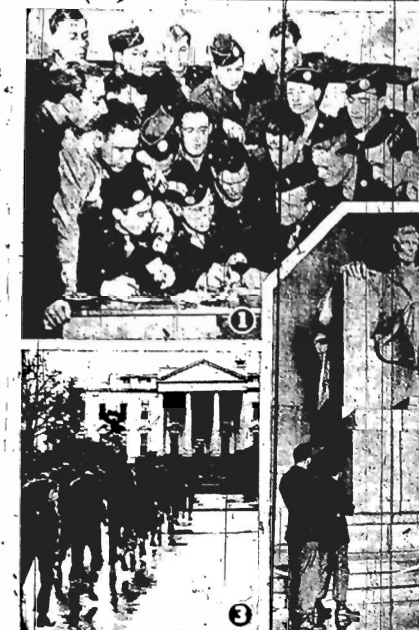


Nazi Forces At Stuninorid Are Liquidated

The wreckage was sighted from SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 31.—(AP)—A four-motored plane carrying 19 passengers, missing for 10 days on a flight from Pearl Harbor to San Francisco with Rear Admiral Robert English and 18 others, was found in the mountains 130 miles north of San Francisco with all aboard presumed dead, the 12th naval district announced today.

Knox Tours Battle Fronts Says U.S. Is Ready To Strike

PEARL HARBOR, Jan. 29.—(Delayed)—(INS)—Secretary of the Navy Knox has completed a two-week, 12,000-mile flying tour of the Pacific battle area during which he twice experienced Japanese air raids, it was revealed today. He visited all Pacific areas except Australia and New Zealand.

100,000 Are Wiped Out In 20 Days

Originally Numbered At 330,000 Men

MOSCOW, Feb. 1.—(Monday)—(AP)—Virtual complete destruction of Hitler's proud Stalingrad siege forces of 330,000 men, with smashing of two crack Nazi armies, killing of 100,000 troops in the last 20 days alone, and capture of a field marshal and 16 generals was announced by the Soviets late tonight in a triumphant special communique.

Land And Air War Continues In New Guinea

ALLIED HEADQUARTERS, Australia, Monday (AP)—Sporadic fighting is continuing in the Mubo-Wau area near Salamaua, New Guinea, the allied forces said today.

Meantime, the allied air forces carried the attack to the enemy's rear, dropping incendiary bombs on the Japanese air base at Koro, destroying of 100 Japanese bombers and heavy bombers. The Japanese were forced to abandon the area and retreat to the coast.

At Weak, New Guinea navy bombers also attacked the perimeter and inflicted serious damage on the Japanese positions there, however.
